

His books have won the top awards in the profession, and he has been president of both major history organizations: the American Historical Association and the Organization of American Historians. He has worked on every detail of *Give Me Liberty!*, which displays all of his trademark strengths as a scholar, teacher, and writer. A specialist on the Civil War/Reconstruction period, he regularly teaches the nineteenth-century survey at Columbia University, where he is DeWitt Clinton Professor of History. In 2011, Foner's *The Fiery Trial: Abraham Lincoln and American Slavery* won the Pulitzer Prize in History, the Bancroft Prize, and the Lincoln Prize.
