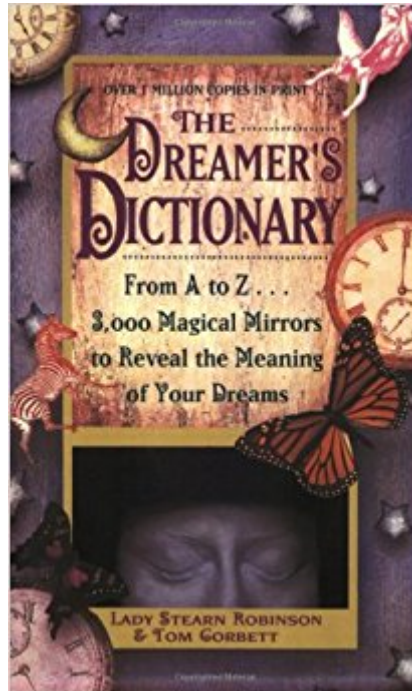

I was looking for a book on dreams that I read years ago. I thought this book might be similar to it. Unfortunately after reading it I am really disappointed in it. It is nothing like the book I had read before. Too many times the meanings are that you are going to come into good health, success, or financial gain. No matter if it is a good dream or a nightmare. These are things that you typically hear if you use a telephone psychic. (No I have not called one, friends here.) While I believe our dreams hold some insight to our subconscious mind. I find this book to be too cookie cutter with its explanations. There were often times I would go and look up a symbol and it was not, even addressed in this book. I certainly don't think that I am the first person to ever dream of the topics. I

am unable to recommend this book from my experience.

Having studied dreams for many years, I got this book hoping the many listings would fill in the gaps of definitions I had not yet learned. However I found that the definitions are inaccurate and frankly, a little lame. This dictionary may contain 3,000 "magical mirrors" but I think that the authors put far too much emphasis on the dream symbols' precognitive meanings (omens for the future) rather than on their symbolic meanings, which are much more common. Many times, according to this dream dictionary, the "omens" that my dreams were supposedly predicting were very unbelievable and even ridiculous. I found this aspect of the book highly frustrating and unhelpful in interpreting my dreams. On a more positive note, there are a few instances where the interpretations did have symbolic meaning (such as the interpretations for colors), or where the symbolic meaning was included along with the "omen". There are many other books that go much more in depth into dream symbolism, with the understanding that dream symbols are not so much omens as deep and profound insights into our waking lives.
