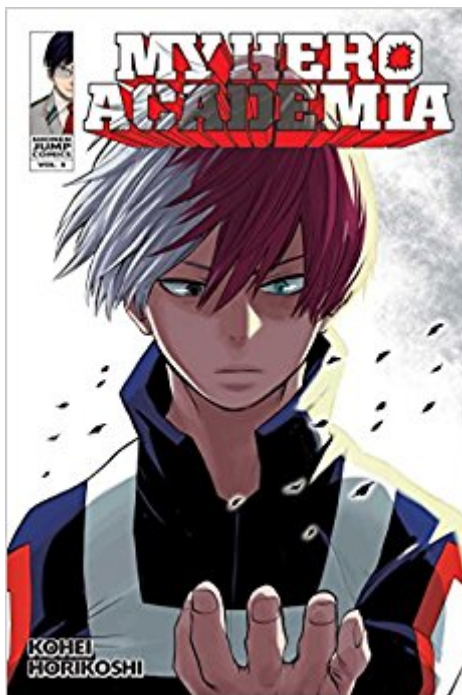

Kouhei Horikoshi was born in Aichi, Japan, in 1986. He received a Tezuka Award Honorable Mention in 2006, and after publishing several short stories in Akamaru Jump, his first serialized work in Weekly Shonen Jump was Oumagadoki Doubutsuen in 2010. My Hero Academia is his third series in Weekly Shonen Jump.

Okay, I have to be completely honest here. So far this is my favorite volume of this series. Every frustration and tension that had been building up in the previous volume is finally unleashed in this one. The climax is perfectly executed, not taking too long and not ending too quick; just perfect! We also get to learn more about Todoroki and his past, which is like an extra plus for me. Altogether this

volume's ending left me a bittersweet feeling but definitely on edge for wanting more! There are new questions, new things we learn here and I honestly can't wait for the next volume to be published!

Out of all the volumes that I have read so far, this is one of the most beautifully executed volumes out there. It starts off exactly from where it left off and plot armor is virtually nonexistent in this volume. In fact, the tournament became less about winning and more about developing and this is an amazing stylistic choice by Horikoshi. This volume has moved me tremendously.

Probably my favorite volume thus far. My Hero academia continues to impress. Do yourself a favor and pick this one up.
