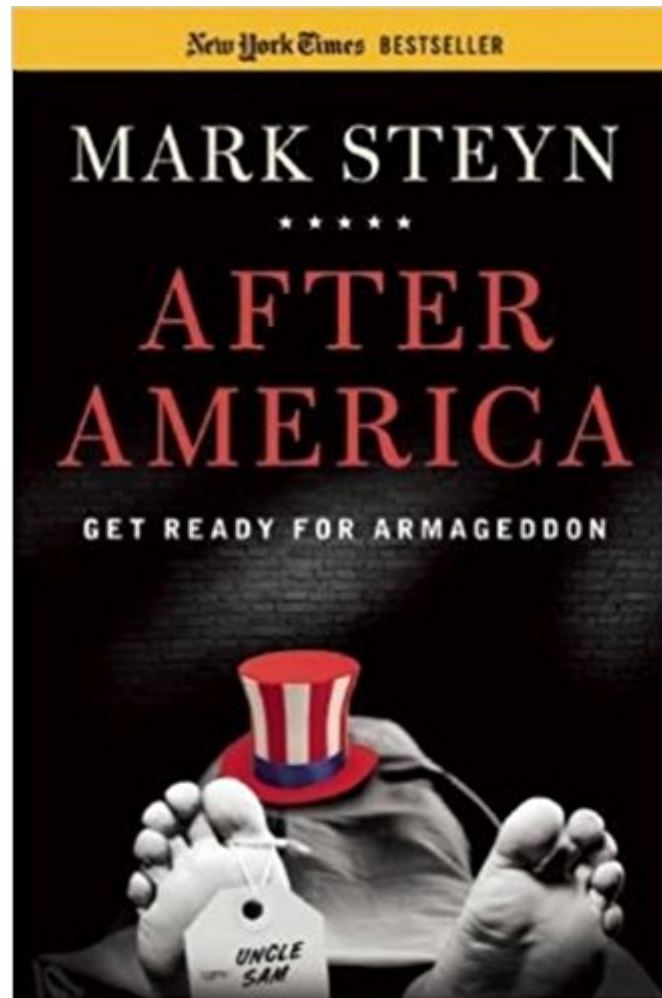




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After America: Get Ready For Armageddon

Mark Steyn is the bestselling author of *After America* and *America Alone*. As usual Mark Steyn manages to be hilarious, erudite, and dead-serious at the same time. He pulls no punches in *After America*, and while reading this excellent book, I frequently didn't know whether to laugh or cry. The author's command of the evidence is undeniable, and his vivid descriptions of the decline of Western Civilization are both frightening and familiar. Crushing debt, out-of-control immigration, denial, and near-universal insouciance are rapidly destroying the West -- right now. Will the American people take heed of the dreary (and increasingly dangerous) state of our world and face up to our responsibilities as citizens of the sole super-power, or will we remain paralyzed and incapable of taking action until it is, quite simply, too late?

Mark Steyn follows up his last book "America Alone." Again, Steyn does a superb job of outlining the crisis America is in, and the steps we should take to avoid becoming the European disastrous experiment. Many admire the European state as a model for America, but Europe was able to become the highly socialist state because America picked up the tab of defending the moral order in the world. When someone else is paying to protect you, why not offer more "services" to your constituents? I enjoyed the quote from Justice Marshall that sums up the growth of the federal government.
