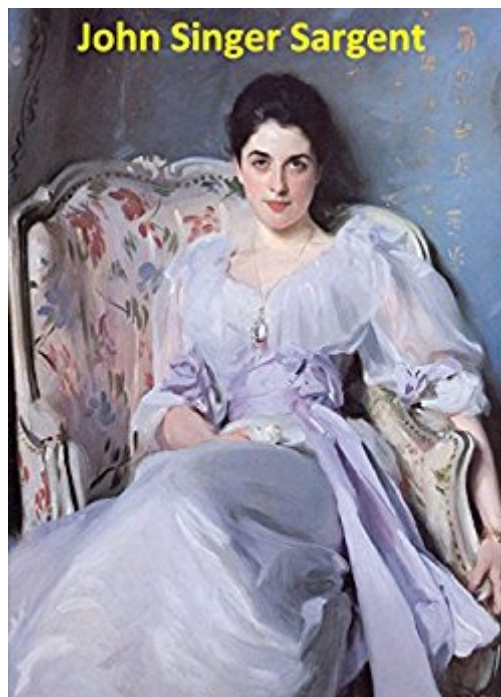

This may work fine on a Kindle Fire, but on a iPad running Kindle, the captions for one painting may appear on the next page over the next painting. Low resolution scans do not expand well - details are murky and the blotchy pixels nearly obscure the picture. No information except the titles (e.g., where each painting currently resides, original size, etc.). Glad it was cheap, and won't purchase any more in the series. Too bad the execution was so poor.

First off, I had formatting issues on the iPad Kindle app, giving the wrong title over each photo of the painting. But I could at least expand the photo or view it in landscape for the best view. So I tried viewing it on an android device but the photos were very small and could not be expanded or even turned to landscape view. But what wonderful works of art! Too bad so much detail is lost!

I don't have an ipad so I don't have anything to say about that. I have a kindle fire, and I LOVE this download! 422 color paintings? They look fine on the kindle, and it really gives you a great range of his work that you won't find in any book. A wonderful visual history, no text necessary. It's like a really good catalog, rather than a coffee table book. So many times I get an art book that I'd rather replace excess text with more images. With this price, how can you go wrong? I love being able to just flip through them. With the kindle app, you can flip through them on your smartphone. You can always spend a lot of money for a fabulous book with interesting history tidbits, and this is not to say this kindle gallery replaces that, it's just different.

The paintings are exquisite. Unfortunately, My three stars are given solely on the basis of the paintings. The actual book is terrible because it says nothing beyond the name and date of each picture. I am always glad to look upon works which fill my heart with esthetic joy but I yearn for more. I want and need an explanation of what the history of each painting is. What did the artist, if anything, say about a painting? Is there any relevant art criticism of the work? What is the historical and personal context behind each painting? As it stands, this book answers none of those questions. In fact it answers virtually no questions. I am not a young man learning to appreciate superb art. We're that the case, I may have been grateful that this book is uncluttered. Ah well. You cannot please everyone. I am grateful to be reacquainted with the artist's work.

I thought this was a very good mix of pictures. I bought this because I am learning to paint with watercolor and acrylic, and the artist's works are perfect for learning about shading and composition. I was very pleased with the quality and the selection of pictures. I highly recommend this book to anyone interested in studying composition or just someone who likes to enjoy beautiful works of art.

The content was good, but unfortunately the resolution was not. This book would have been worth having if the pictures had been sharp enough to provide accurate details for zooming in. M. Eaves
