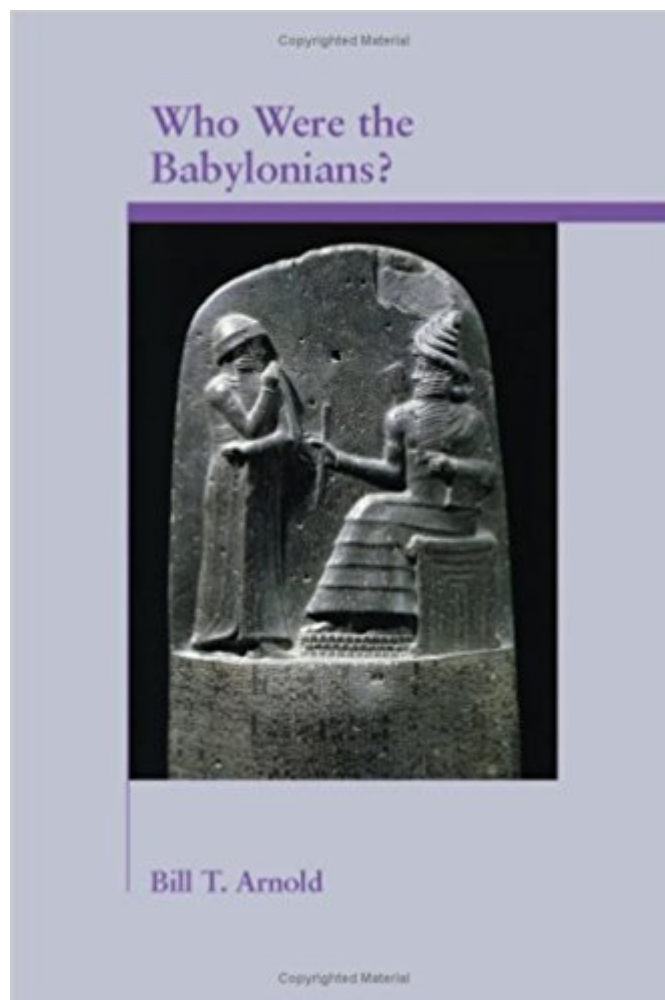




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Who Were The Babylonians? (Archaeology And Biblical Studies) (Sbl - Archaeology And Biblical Studies)
