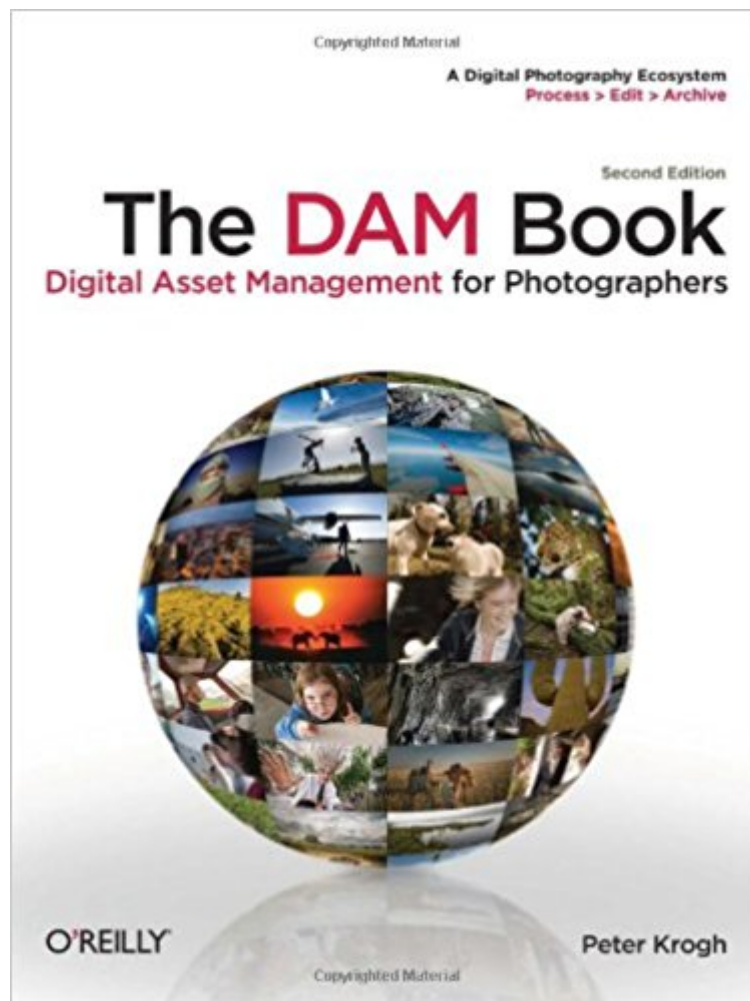




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The DAM Book: Digital Asset Management For Photographers

This book is far more than an update on the original DAM book. It has been completely re-written and is far more expansive and comprehensive than Peter Krogh's first book. Keeping track of the thousands of photos that not only professional but even amateur photographers generate is a difficult task. Krogh doesn't necessarily make it easy since this is a complex issue, but he does a fantastic job taking this complex issue and making it into something that is not only comprehensible but capable of being actually useful. He deals with each issue involved in cataloging in a straight forward and logical manner and moves on to the next, building on the previous issue, such that by the end of the book you have a complete and logical system that will enable you to catalog, search and backup your entire photo collection.

This is an incredible "guide book". It will change the way you archive your images. This book has laid out the path for better, safer storage of my images and with the key-wording, an easier way to find select images when I need them. Excellent, well written book, with sound advice. Good for the professional and for the hobbyist photographer. Give this method a try, you will never look back.
