

Read this after "To kill a mocking bird" (for the 5th or 6th time) and after the new release of "The Watchman". This is like a two-fer because so much info is there about Harper Lee AND Truman Capote. Wonderful biography, brings you closer to the woman who authored the award winning book.

I have taught "To Kill a Mockingbird" (TKAM) in my sophomore English classes for eleven years. This biography provided interesting insights into the life of Harper Lee, and I saw many connections to TKAM. For example, the fact that Mrs. Finch has passed away and is barely mentioned in the novel always perplexed me. After reading the book, I now know why. I also know why Nelle/Harper Lee originally planned to name the book "Atticus." The biography is a "must" for anyone teaching TKAM or anyone who just loves the book (count me for both).

The story of Nelle's life is almost as fascinating as Scouts' with so many parallels, it makes for a great read!
